TO THE JSO'S 2023/24 SEASON

The Jackson Symphony Orchestra is pleased to present our 74th **Classical Concert Series** season and the 10th season of our **Music on Tap Series**. There is no denying the power of live music. The exchange of energy between the audience and performer benefits both and makes life better. We have been hard at work planning this season, and you can expect to see some new faces and old friends this year.

This year's **Classical Concert Series** (formerly Signature Series) theme is "**Musical Greetings From...**" Maestro Aubin has created a program highlighting music from different places, both by well-known composers like **Aaron Copland**, **Felix Mendelssohn**, and **Maurice Ravel**, and composers historically underrepresented like **Camille Pépin**, **Grażyna Bacewicz**, and **Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel** to name just a few.

The first half of the season focuses on American music, and we are pleased to welcome **William Hagen** for the first time and Jackson native **Hannah Holman** back home, for the first and second concerts of the year. In the second half of the season, we highlight talent on the rise, including French violin virtuoso **Eva Zavaro**, the return to

Jackson of Swedish Chamber Orchestra concertmaster **Clara Saitkoulov**, and the winner of the Gilmore Piano Festival's Young Artist award.

Our **Music on Tap Series** celebrates its 10th season and expands to eight concerts. We continue to focus on bringing top-notch talent to Jackson. This season will include Jazz, Blues, the return of a comedy show with our friend **Heywood Banks** and our always-popular **Irish Festival** (this season headlined by a band from Scotland).

Our **Summer Pops Concert** continues to be a free event at Blackman Park. In addition, watch for another iteration of our **Halloween Children's Concert** at the Michigan Theatre of Jackson in the fall. Finally, we will again partner with Ballet Chelsea to bring you the return of **The Nutcracker**, a Holiday tradition for so many in our community.




WEATHERWAX HALL AT THE JSO

The JSO has performed with many legendary figures including Pascal Rogé, Inon Barnatan, Vanessa Perez, Dizzy Gillespie, Grant Johannesen, Ed Asner, William Warfield, and Ralph Votapek. The orchestra has also toured with Mannheim Steamroller, Ann Murray, and the Manhattan Transfer. Since assuming the Music Director position in 2017, Matthew Aubin has catapulted the JSO to higher levels of artistic excellence. He has launched several innovative initiatives including partnerships with the Gilmore Keyboard Festival, the University of Michigan, Michigan State University, and Ballet Chelsea. In recent years, the JSO has also significantly expanded its community programming including educational programs for children, family programming, and a non-classical series titled 'Music-on-Tap' featuring touring musicians from many varied genres.
